

Menagerie

- : A menagerie is a collection of wild animals.

본문) She was just the newest member of Simon's menagerie.

Detention

- : Detention is when someone is arrested or put into prison, especially for political reasons.
- :(유치장, 교도소)구금
- 본문) "Hey, good job getting detention, nutcase."

Obsessive

: If someone's behaviour is **obsessive**, they cannot stop doing a particular

thing or behaving in a particular way.

- : 강박적인, 사로잡혀있는
- 본문) He's becoming more and more obsessive about punctuality

Dominated

- : If one country or person **dominates** another, they have power over them.
- : 지배(군림)하다

본문) A massive desk covered in old paper and glass jar dominated one side of the room.

Pinched

: If someone's face is **pinched**, it looks thin and pale, usually because they are ill or old.

: (사람얼굴이)파리한, 초췌한

본문) Arthur didn't look like that old, but he had a pinched mouth and he seemed stuooy.

Stuffy

: Stuffy people or institutions are formal and old-fashioned

: (건물 등)환기가 안되어 답답한, 딱딱한, 격식적인,

본문) He is too stuffy to enjoy the clowns at the circus

Humiliation

: Humiliation is the embarrassment and shame you feel when someone makes you appear stupid, or when you make a mistake in public.

: 굴욕, 치욕

본문) There are huge interludes of misery and humiliation.

Fey

: If you describe someone as **fey**, you mean that they behave in a shy, childish, or unpredictable way, and you are often suggesting that this is unnatural or insincere

: 못마땅함, 특이함, 비현실적인

Stabbing

: A **stabbing** is an incident in which someone stabs someone else with a knife

: (통증이)찌르는, 쑤시는듯한

본문) Mallory was close to the carriage house, stabbing at the air with her foil.

Squinted

: If you squint at something, you look at it with your eyes partly closed.

:(눈을 가리고)찡그리고 보다

본문) Jared squinted and looked in the direction the brownie indicated.

Foe

: Someone's foe is their enemy

: 적

본문) Then Simon fell to the ground, still fighting some invisible foe.

Gleam

: If an object or a surface **gleams**, it reflects light because it is shiny and clean.

: 어슴푸레(희미하게) 빛나다

본문) Thimbletack's black eyes gleamed.

Goblin

: In fairy stories, a **goblin** is a small, ugly creature which usually enjoys causing trouble

: (이야기 속에 나오는 작고 추하게 생긴)마귀, 도깨비

본문) "But how come I can see you and not the goblins?"

Ruffle

: If you **ruffle** someone's hair, you move your hand backwards and forwards through it as a way of showing your affection towards them

: (반반한 표면을)헝클다

본문) Jared grabbed the Guide and ruffled through pages he knew nearly by heart

Skitter

: If something skitters, it moves about very lightly and quickly.

: (잽싸게, 경쾌하게)달리다, 나아가다

CHAPTER 2

sprint

: if you sprint, you run or ride as fast as you can over a short distance

: 전력질주하다

Ex. Sergeant Horne sprinted to the car

lawn

: A lawn is an area of grass that is kept cut short nad is usually part of someone's garden or backyard, or part of a park

:숲속의 빈 터

Ex. The lawn contained a mixture of grasses

tug

: if you tug something or tug at it, you give it a quick and usually strong pull : (세게) 당기다, 끌다

Ex. The baby was tugging at his coat to show that he wanted to be picked up

goblin

: In fairy stories, a goblin is a small, ugly creature which usually enjoys causing trouble.

: 악귀, 도깨비

Ex. To me, Central Park has an atmosphere of mystery, as if it were enchanted with fairies and goblins.

narrow

: If your eyes narrow or if you narrow your eyes, you almost close them, for example because you are angry or because you are trying to concentrate on something.

: 좁히다, 좁게 하다; 가늘게 하다

Ex. Access was via a narrow archway

shrill

: A shrill sound is high-pitched and unpleasant

:<(목)소리 등이> 날카로운, 새된, 높은

Ex. Shrill voices on both sides of the Atlantic are advocating protectionism

brownie

: Brownies are small flat biscuits or cakes. They are usually chocolate flavoured and have nuts in them.

: 브라우니 《스코틀랜드 전설에서 밤에 나타나서 몰래 농가의 일을 도와준다는 작은 요정》

Ex. They're just trying to score brownie points with politicians

yank

: If you yank someone or something somewhere, you pull them there suddenly and with a lot of force.

: 홱 잡아당기다(jerk);홱 잡아당겨 …의 상태로 하다

Ex. When the wind pulls against the sail from a sharp angle, the shock could yank the knot up the pole

demand

: If you demand something such as information or action, you ask for it in a very forceful way.

: 요구[요청]하다, 청구하다

Ex. The Commission can't demand from Sweden more than it demands from its own members.

ignore

: If you ignore someone or something, you pay no attention to them

: 무시하다, 모르는 체하다, 묵살하다, 상대하지 않다

Ex. She said her husband ignored her.

clutter

: If things or people clutter a place, they fill it in an untidy way.

: <장소를> 어지르다

Ex. The vehicles cluttered up the car park

mildew

: Mildew is a soft white fungus that grows in damp places

: 흰곰팡이

Ex. He was already asleep in the bed, which smelled faintly of mildew

stable

: When horses are stabled, they are put into a stable.

: 안정된, 견실한, 동요하지 않는, 고정된

occupy

: If a room or something such as a seat is occupied, someone is using it,

so that it is not available for anyone else.

: <장소를> 차지하다;<시일을> 소비하다

Ex. They occupied the first two floors of the tower

scurry

: If people scurry to do something, they do it as soon as they can

: 허둥지둥[총총걸음으로] 달리다, 잰 걸음으로 서두르다

Ex. The attack began, sending residents scurrying for cover

drown

: If you say that a person or thing is drowning in something, you are emphasizing that they have a very large amount of it, or are completely covered in it.

: 물에 빠져 죽게 하다, 익사시키다

Ex. Animals get tangled in fishing nets and drown

eyepiece

: The eyepiece of a microscope or telescope is the piece of glass at one end, where you put your eye in order to look through the instrument.

: 접안[대안]렌즈, 접안경

clamp

- : A clamp is a device that holds two things firmly together
- : 죄는 기구, 죔쇠, 거멀못, 꺾쇠;【목공】 나비장
- Ex. Some clamps that had held the device together came undone

device

: A device is an object that has been invented for a particular purpose, for

example for recording or measuring something.

: 장치;고안품, (어떤 목적에 맞도록 꾸며진) 설비

Ex. The device exploded underneath a van

frustrate

: If something frustrates you, it upsets or angers you because you are unable to do anything about the problems it creates.

: 좌절시키다

Ex. Doesn't it frustrate you that audiences in the theatre are so restricted?

Bloated

: swollen, as with a liquid, air, or wind

: A fencing sword having a usually circular guard and a thin, flexible foursided blade with a button on the tip to prevent injury.

Grunt

Shuffle

- : walk by dragging one's feet

Ex. I shuffle my feet around the house to keep from stepping on him.

Plank

: A piece of lumber cut thicker than a board.

: 널빤지

Ex. He sawed the plank in half.

Fumble

: To touch or handle clumsily or idly

: 더듬거리다.

Ex. She fumbled around in her pocket for a pencil.

On one's mark, one two three./get set go/ready set go.

Sprint

: To move rapidly or at top speed for a brief period, as in running or swimming

: To twist or turn suddenly and forcibly.

: 비틀다.

Ex. He wrenched the boy's wrist.



cautious/cautiously

: Someone who is cautious acts very carefully in order to avoid possible danger.

Ex. He has a cautious attitude about spending money.

dodge

: If you dodge something, you avoid it by quickly moving aside or out of reach so that it cannot hit or reach you. : 몸을 재빨리 피하다

Ex. He desperately dodged a speeding car trying to run him down.

trunk

: The trunk of a tree is the large main stem from which the branches grow.

Ex. the gnarled trunk of a birch tree

gnaw

: If people or animals gnaw something or gnaw at it, they bite it repeatedly.

: 물어뜯다, 갉아먹다

Ex. Melanie gnawed a long, painted fingernail.

weave - wove - woven

: If you weave cloth or a carpet, you make it by crossing threads over and under each other using a frame or machine called a loom.

: 짜다, 엮다

Ex. In one room, young mothers weave while babies doze in their laps.

: If someone or something is squashed, they are pressed or crushed with such force that they become injured or lose their shape.

chime

lean

: If you lean an object on or against something, you place the object so that it is partly supported by that thing.

Ex. Lean the plants against a wall and cover the roots with peat.

lick

: When people or animals lick something, they move their tongue across its surface.

: 핥아먹다

Ex. The dog rose awkwardly to his feet and licked the man's hand excitedly.

charred

: Charred plants, buildings, or vehicles have been badly burnt and have become black because of fire.

Ex. the charred remains of a tank.

bark

: If you bark at someone, you shout at them aggressively in a loud, rough voice.

shudder

: If you shudder, you shake with fear, horror, or disgust, or because you are cold.

Ex. Lloyd had urged her to eat caviar. She had shuddered at the thought.

whizz

: If something whizzes somewhere, it moves there very fast.

: 쌩하고 지나가다

Ex. A car whizzed past.

hefty

: Hefty means large in size, weight, or amount.

Ex. She was quite a hefty woman

squint

: If you squint at something, you look at it with your eyes partly closed.

: 눈을 가늘게 뜨고 보다

Ex. The girl squinted at the photograph.

direction

: A direction is the general line that someone or something is moving or pointing in.

: 방향

Ex. He drove off in the direction of Larry's shop.



shrill

: A shrill sound is high-pitched and unpleasant.

: 꽥 소리 지르다, 날카로운 소리로 말하다

Ex. Mary Ann's voice grew shrill.

creep - crept - crept

: When people or animals creep somewhere, they move quietly and slowly.

Ex. The rabbit creeps away and hides in a hole.

curl up

: to lie down or sit down with your back curved and your knees and arms

close to your body

: 몸을 웅크리다

Ex. The cat was curled up asleep under the bush.

hawk

: A hawk is a large bird with a short, hooked beak, sharp claws, and very good eyesight. Hawks catch and eat small birds and animals.

: OH

Ex. A hawk flew with flaps of the wings in the sky.

flank

- : An animal's flank is its side, between the ribs and the hip.
- : The side of anything large can be referred to as its flank

Ex. He put his hand on the dog's flank.

Ex. They continued along the flank of the mountain.

streak

: If something streaks a surface, it makes long stripes or marks on the surface.

: 줄무늬 내다

Ex. His face was pale and streaked with dirt.

wedge

: If you wedge something, you force it to remain in a particular position by holding it there tightly or by fixing something next to it to prevent it from moving.

: 좁은 틈으로 끼워넣다

Ex. I shut the shed door and wedged it with a log of wood.

bark

: Bark is the tough material that covers the outside of a tree.

: 나무껍질

Ex. The bark of the trunk was riven off[away].

bough

: A bough is a large branch of a tree.

Ex. I rested my fishing rod against a pine bough.

squirrel

: A squirrel is a small animal with a long furry tail. Squirrels live mainly in trees.

: 다람쥐

Ex. The squirrel is next to the tree.

suspiciously

: You can use suspiciously when you are describing something that you think is slightly strange or not as it should be.

: 미심쩍게, 꺼림칙하다는 듯이

Ex. He lives alone in a suspiciously tidy flat in Notting Hill Gate.

grip

: If you grip something, you take hold of it with your hand and continue to hold it firmly.

: 꽉 잡다

Ex. She gripped the rope.

rot

: If you say that someone is being left to rot in a particular place, especially in a prison, you mean that they are being left there and their physical and mental condition is being allowed to get worse and worse.

: 상황을 악화시키다

Ex. The rot set in last year when they reorganized the department.

beetlehead

: 미련퉁이

holler

: If you holler, you shout loudly.

: 소리치다

Ex. Don't holler at me!

: used to show that you agree with somebody or are not surprised to hear

something

: 설마 그럴라고 (상대방의 말을 믿지 않음.)

Ex. 'I'm going to tell her what I think of her.' 'Yeah, I bet!'

slapped

: If you slap someone, you hit them with the palm of your hand.

: 손바닥으로 철썩 때리다

Ex. I slapped him hard across the face.

snatch

: If you snatch something or snatch at something, you take it or pull it away quickly.

: 낚아채다

Ex. He snatched up the telephone.

dumb

: If you call a person dumb, you mean that they are stupid or foolish.

: 말을 못하는; 바보같은, 멍청한

Ex. The questions were set up to make her look dumb.

drawn up

: to come to a stop; to make something/somebody/yourself stop

: 다가와서 서다

Ex. A taxi drew up outside.

thorn

: Thorns are the sharp points on some plants and trees, for example on a rose bush.

: 가시

Ex. A thorn has stuck into my finger.



sawing

: If you saw something, you cut it with a saw.

: 톱질하듯 하다



Ex. Your father is sawing wood. (출처 : 네이버사전)

knotted

: If you knot a piece of string, rope, cloth, or other material, you pass one end or part of it through a loop and pull it tight.

: 매듭된

Ex. a knotted rope.



quaver

: If someone's voice quavers, it sounds unsteady, usually because they are nervous or uncertain.

: 목소리가 떨리다

Ex. Her voice quavered and she fell silent

squeeze out

: to prevent somebody/something from doing something or from doing business.

:~을 몰아내다

Ex. Small firms are being squeezed out by larger companies

spit

: Spit is the watery liquid produced in your mouth. You usually use spit to refer to an amount of it that has been forced out of someone's mouth.

: 침

Ex. He wet his hand with spit and gripped the rope.

gross

: You use gross to describe something unacceptable or unpleasant to a very great amount, degree, or intensity.

: 역겨운

Ex. The company were guilty of gross negligence.

hesitate

: If you hesitate to do something, you delay doing it or are unwilling to do it, usually because you are not certain it would be right. If you do not hesitate to do something, you do it immediately.

: 망설이다

Ex. Some parents hesitate to take these steps because they suspect that their child is exaggerating.

stuck

: If something is stuck in a particular position, it is fixed tightly in this position and is unable to move.

: (장소에) 갇힌, 빠져나갈 수 없는

Ex. He said his car had got stuck in the snow

eyepiece

: The eyepiece of a microscope or telescope is the piece of glass at one end, where you put your eye in order to look through the instrument.

: 접안렌즈

Ex. The woman is looking through her camcorder's eyepiece.

skeptically

: A sceptic is a person who has doubts about things that other people believe.

: 의심많은

Ex. I looked at him skeptically, sure he was exaggerating.

grumble

: If someone grumbles, they complain about something in a bad-tempered way.


