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CHAPTER 1

Dew

: the very small drops of water that form on the ground, etc. during the night
: 이슬

Ex. The grass was wet with early morning dew.

Shimmer

: to shine with a soft light that seems to move slightly
: 희미하게 반짝이다

Ex. The sea was shimmering in the sunlight.

Trudge

: to walk slowly or with heavy steps, because you are tired or carrying sth heavy
: 터벅터벅 걷다

Ex. He trudged the last two miles to the town.

Clutch

: to hold sb/sth tightly
: 꼭 잡다

Ex. He clutched the child to him.

Shuffle

: [v+adv./prep.] to walk slowly without lifting your feet completely off the ground

: 발을 끌며 걷다

Ex. He shuffled across the room to the window.

Stray

: [+adv./prep.] to move away from the place where you should be, without intending to

: 무의식적으로 움직이다, 길에서 벗어나다

Ex. He strayed into the path of an oncoming car.

Distract

: [vn] ~ sb/sth from sth to take sb's attention away from what they are trying to do

: 마음을 흐트러뜨리다, 주의를 환기시키다

Ex. You're distracting me from my work.

Furious

: very angry

: 격노하여, 화내어 날뛰는

Ex. I'm furious that I wasn't told about it.

Kettle

: a container with a lid, handle and a spout, used for boiling water

: 찻주전자

Ex. I'll put the kettle on (=start boiling some water) and make some tea.

Litter

: to be spread around a place, making it look untidy

: 어질러 놓다

Ex. Broken glass littered the streets.

Screech

: to make a loud high unpleasant sound: to say sth using this sound

: 날카로운 소리, 킁킁하는 소리

Ex. He screeched with pain.

Exasperation

: The state of being exasperated

: 격노, 분노

Ex. The mother tried to control her exasperation with her children and talk to them patiently.

Squint

: to look at sth with your eyes partly shut in order to keep out bright light or to see better

: 결눈질하다, 눈을 가늘게 뜨다

Ex. She was squinting through the keyhole.

Dread

: a feeling of great fear about sth that might or will happen in the future; a thing that causes this feeling

: 공포, 불안

Ex. The prospect of growing old fills me with dread.

Smash

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: to break sth, or to be broken, violently and noisily into many pieces

: 때려 부수다

Ex. Several windows had been smashed.

Hinge

: a piece of metal, plastic, etc. on which a door, lid or gate moves freely as it opens or closes

: 경첩, 돌쩌귀

Ex. The door had been pulled off its hinges.



Dart

: ~ a glance/look (at sb) to look at sb suddenly and quickly

: 시선을 던지다

Ex. He darted an impatient look at Vicky.

Faucet

: a device that controls the flow of water from a pipe

: 수도꼭지, tap

Ex. to turn a faucet on/off

Defrosting

: to become or make sth warmer, especially food, so that it is no longer frozen

: 서리를 없애다, 녹이다

Ex. It will take about four hours to defrost.

Plaster

: a substance made of lime, water and sand, that is put on walls and ceilings to give them a smooth hard surface

: 회반죽, 가루석고

Ex. an old house with crumbling plaster and a leaking roof

Mingling

: to combine or make one thing combine with another

: 섞다, 섞이다

Ex. Her tears mingled with the blood on her face.

Caning

: the act of providing chairs or the like with seats made of woven cane.

: 의자 등자리

Rip

: to tear sth or to become torn, often suddenly or violently

: 찢어지다, 해집어지다

Ex. I ripped my jeans on the fence.

Shatter

: to suddenly break into small pieces; to make sth suddenly break into small pieces

: 산산이 부서지다

Ex. The explosion shattered all the windows in the building.

Drift

: a large pile of sth, especially snow, made by the wind

: 바람에 날려 쌓인 것

Ex. The road was blocked by deep drifts of snow.

Brocade

: to weave with a raised design or figure

: 수단, 문직으로 짜여진, 무늬를 도드라지게 짠

Ex. Women often wore a top layer of the stola, for the rich in brocade.

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Footstool

: a low piece of furniture used for resting your feet on when you are sitting
: 발 올려놓는 대

Ex. A footstool is a piece of furniture, the purpose of which is to support one's feet.

Scoff

: to talk about sb/sth in a way that makes it clear that you think they are stupid or ridiculous
: 비웃다

Ex. Don't scoff—she's absolutely right.

Squeak

: to speak in a very high voice, especially when you are nervous or excited
: 킁킁거리며 말하다, 양양 울다

Ex. Let go of me!' he squeaked nervously.

Ruin

: to damage sth so badly that it loses all its value, pleasure, etc.; to spoil sth
: 파괴되다

Ex. The bad weather ruined our trip.

Vigorous

: very active, determined or full of energy
: 힘찬, 정력적인

Ex. This plant is a vigorous grower.

Scrub

: to clean sth by rubbing it hard, perhaps with a brush and usually with soap and water

: 북북 문지르다

Ex. She scrubbed the counters down with bleach.

Squat

: to sit on your heels with your knees bent up close to your body
: 웅크리다, 쪼그리고 앉다

본문) Mallory squatted beside the footstool.

Filthy

: very dirty and unpleasant
: 불결한, 더러운, 추악한

Ex. It's filthy in here!

Hireling

: a person who is willing to do anything or work for anyone as long as they are paid
: 부하

본문) master worse than his hirelings.

Dwell

: to live somewhere
: 살다, 거주하다

Ex. For ten years she dwelled among the nomads of North America.

Foul

: dirty and smelling bad
: 더러운, 불결한
Ex. a foul-smelling prison

Clatter

: to move making a loud noise like hard objects knocking together
: 달가닥거리다

Ex. She heard him clattering around downstairs.

Wreckage

: the parts of a vehicle, building, etc. that remain after it has been badly damaged or destroyed

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: 잔해물

Ex. A few survivors were pulled from the wreckage.

Soak

: to put sth in liquid for a time so that it becomes completely wet; to become completely wet in this way

: 적시다, 담그다

Ex. I usually soak the beans overnight.

Ransack

: to make a place untidy, causing damage, because you are looking for sth

: 샅샅이 뒤지다

Ex. He ransacked the room for the key.

Crouch

: to put your body close to the ground by bending your legs under you

: 쭈그리고 앉다

Ex. He crouched down beside her.

Wriggle

: to twist and turn your body or part of it with quick short movements

: 꿈틀거리다

Ex. The baby was wriggling around on my lap.

Shred

: to cut or tear sth into small pieces

: 조각조각 찢다

Ex. Serve the fish on a bed of shredded lettuce.

Numb

: unable to feel, think or react in the normal way

: 감각을 잃은

Ex. He felt numb with shock.

Desecration

: divest of sacred or hallowed character or office.

: 신성 모독

본문) There was something about the desecration of this one room.

Trudge

: to walk slowly or with heavy steps, because you are tired or carrying sth heavy

: 터벅터벅 걷다

Ex. He trudged the last two miles to the town.

Splinter

: to break, or to make sth break, into small, thin sharp pieces

: 쪼개다, 찢다

Ex. The mirror cracked but did not splinter.

Pry

: to try to find out information about other people's private lives in a way that is annoying or rude

: 엿보다, 탐색하다

Ex. She tried to keep the children away from the prying eyes of the world's media.

Gingerly

: in a careful way, because you are afraid of being hurt, of making a noise, etc.

: 매우 조심스럽게

Ex. He opened the box gingerly and looked inside.

Sill

: a piece of metal that forms part of the frame of a vehicle below the doors

: 문지방, 창문턱

Ex. I used to have it up on my window sill

Blurry

: without a clear outline; not clear

: 더러워진, 흐릿한

Ex. I think almost all of my blurry photos are with the flash.

CHAPTER 2

Gawp

: look with amazement

: 뻘히 쳐다보다

Ex. Thorpe could only stand and **gawp**.

Brandish

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: move or swing back and forth
: (무기, 지팡이 따위)를 휘두르다
Ex. He did not **brandish** a weapon.

Slingshot



: a Y-shaped stick having an elastic strap attached to the prongs, used for flinging small stones
: 새총
Ex. Leany, who used a **slingshot**, said he will pay for damages.

Menacingly

: in a menacing manner
: 위협적으로
Ex. As both coaches came **menacingly** to the field officials feared a violent fight would ensure.

Talon

: the similar claw of a predatory animal
: 발톱
Ex. A raptor is a bird that hunts for food using its **talons**.

Feline



: any of various lithe-bodied roundheaded fissiped mammals, many with retractile claws

: 고양이과의 동물
Ex. The **feline** world includes lions, tigers, panthers, and house cats.

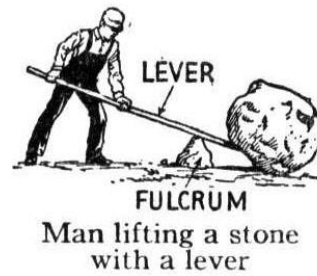
Writhe

: to twist, as in pain, struggle, or embarrassment
: 몸부림치다
Ex. She was **writhing** around on the floor in agony.

Feral

: existing in a wild or untamed state
: 야생의
Ex. **Feral** cats have adapted well to life in the desert.

Lever



: to move or lift with or as if with a lever
: ~을 (지레로) 움직이다
Ex. They managed to **lever** the door open.

Holler

: to yell or shout
: 외치다
Ex. **Holler** when you're ready for a drink.

Sprawl

: to sit or lie with the body and limbs spread out awkwardly
: 팔다리를 아무렇게나 벌리고 앉다, 큰 대자로 눕다
Ex. He was **sprawling** in an armchair in front of the TV.

Tug of war

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: a contest of strength in which two teams tug on opposite ends of a rope, each trying to pull the other across a dividing line

: 줄다리기

Ex. The two parties were in a bitter **tug-of-war**.

Pry

: to raise, move, or force open with a lever

: ~을 지레로 들어올리다

Ex. He **pried** up a stone with a lever.

Strain

: to pull, draw, or stretch tight

: ~을 팽팽하게 하다, 잡아당기다

Ex. She **strained** against the ropes that held her.

Gutter

: a trough fixed under or along the eaves for draining rainwater from a roof

: 배수로

Ex. He dropped his keys in the **gutter**.

Haul

: something that is pulled or transported

: 잡은 것, 획득물

Ex. Angling is a great fun when there is a good **haul** of fish.

Lair

: the den or dwelling of a wild animal

: 은신처

Ex. All the animals are smothered in their **lair**s.

Dagger



: a short pointed weapon with sharp edges

: (양날의) 단도

Ex. He thrust a **dagger** into his enemy's heart

Shard

: a piece of broken pottery, especially one found in an archaeological dig

: 조각, 파편

Ex. There is a **shard** of glass in his finger.

CHAPTER 3

Overwhelming

: having such a great effect on you that you feel confused and do not know how to react

: 너무도 강력한, 엄청난

Ex. She felt an **overwhelming** desire to hit him.

Urge

: a strong wish or need

: 욕구, 충동

Ex. Suddenly she had an overwhelming **urge** to be with her son.

Reckless

: not caring or worrying about the possible bad or dangerous results of your actions

: 무모한, 신중하지 못한

Ex. He was accused of causing death by **reckless driving**.

Mortal

: a human - used especially when comparing humans with gods, spirits etc

: 인간

Ex. She likes old stories about gods and **mortals**.

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Value

: the importance or usefulness of something

: 가치

Ex. The **value** of regular exercise should not be underestimated.

Convince

: to persuade someone to do something

: 설득시키다

Ex. I've been trying to **convince** Jean to come with me.

Possession

: if something is in your possession, you own it, or you have obtained it from somewhere

: 소유, 소지

Ex. That information is not in our **possession**.

Giddily

: feeling slightly sick and unable to balance, because everything seems to be moving

: 현기증 나게, 정신을 못 차려

Ex. She swayed **giddily** across the dance floor.

Spiral

: to move in a continuous curve that gets nearer to or further from its central point as it goes round

: 나선형으로 움직이다

Ex. The damaged plane **spiraled** to the ground.

Audience

: a formal meeting with a very important person

: 접견, 알현

Ex. He was **granted** an **audience** with the president.

Shed

: to drop something or allow it to fall

: 흘리다, 떨어뜨리다

Ex. A duck's feathers **shed** water immediately.

Squabble

: to argue about something unimportant

: 옥신각신하다, 티격태격 다투다

Ex. They're always **squabbling** over money.

Typical

: having the usual features or qualities of a particular group or thing

: 전형적인, 일반적인

Ex. This advertisement is a **typical example** of their marketing strategy.

Flaw

: a mistake, mark, or weakness that makes something imperfect

: 약점

Ex. There is always a **flaw** in the character of a tragic hero.

Vain

: someone who is vain is too proud of their good looks, abilities, or position – used to show disapproval

: 자만심이 강한, 허영심이 많은

Ex. She is too **vain** to wear glasses.

Prone

: likely to do something or suffer from something, especially something bad or harmful

: ~하는 경향이 있는

Ex. Kids are all **prone** to eat junk food.

Brag

: to talk too proudly about what you have done, what you own etc – used to show disapproval

: 자랑하다, 떠벌리다

Ex. 'I came out top in the test,' he **bragged**.

Puss in Boots

: a fairy tale about a clever cat who wore boots and did many tricks in order to make his owner rich

: 동화 '장화 신은 고양이'

본문. "Like in the '**Puss in Boots**' story?"

Garment

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: a piece of clothing

: 의복, 옷

Ex. She pulled the **garment** on and zipped it up.

Cull

: to find or choose information from many different places

: ~에서 발췌하다, 고르다

Ex. The data had been **culled** from a variety of sources.

Digress

: to talk or write about something that is not your main subject

: 주제에서 벗어나다, 여담을 하다

Ex. Do you mind if I **digress** for a moment?

Wyrm

: European dragon, particularly one without legs or wings

: 다리나 날개가 없어진 유럽의 용

본문. European **wyrm** variety most common to this region.

Whorl

: a pattern made of a line that curls out in circles that get bigger and bigger

: 소용돌이 모양

Ex. Fingerprints is the **whorls** on your fingertips.

Obscure

: to prevent something from being seen or heard clearly

: 보기 어렵게 하다

Ex. The view was **obscured** by mist.

Boundary

: the real or imaginary line that marks the edge of a state, country etc, or the edge of an area of land that belongs to someone

: 경계선

Ex. *We* walked through the churchyard towards the **boundary** wall.

CHAPTER 4

Jostle

: to push roughly against sb in a crowd

: 거칠게 밀치다

Ex. People jostled me on the bus, and I nearly fell.

Pick one's nose

: 코를 후비다

Ex. When I looked at him, he was picking his nose.

Squirm

: If you squirm, you move your body from side to side, usually because you are nervous or uncomfortable.

: (초조하거나 불편하여 몸을) 꿈틀[꿈지락]대다

Ex. The children were squirming restlessly in their seats.

Haphazard

: with no particular order or plan

: 무계획적인, 되는 대로

Ex. The books had been piled on the shelves in a haphazard fashion.

Swell

: to become bigger or rounder

: 부풀다, 팽창

Ex. a swell of pride

Heap

: an untidy pile of sth

: 더미, 많음

본문) Jared saw several goblins peering out of the rusted heap of a car.

Hound

: a dog that can run fast and has a good sense of smell, used for hunting

: 사냥개

Ex. a hound in the pursuit of rabbits

tarnish

: if metal tarnishes or sth tarnishes it, it no longer looks bright and shiny

: 흐려지다, 더러워지다

Ex. The mirrors had tarnished with age.

Fray

: if cloth frays or sth frays it, the threads in it start to come apart

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: 닳게 하다

Ex. This material frays easily.

Brag

: to talk too proudly about sth you own or sth you have done

: 자랑하다

Ex. His performance was nothing to brag about.

Trail off/away

: if somebody's speech trails away/off, it gradually becomes quieter and then stops

: 말소리가 차츰 잦아들다

Ex. His voice trailed away to nothing.

Scallywag

: a person, especially a child, who behaves badly, but not in a serious way

: 말썽쟁이

본문) I still caught the scallywags!

Wobble

: to move from side to side in an unsteady way

: (불안정하게) 흔들리다

Ex. Her voice wobbled with emotion.

Droop

: to bend, hang or move downwards, especially because of being weak or tired

: 아래로 처지다

Ex. She was so tired, her eyelids were beginning to droop.

Jagged

: Something that is jagged has a rough, uneven shape or edge with lots of sharp points.

: 삐죽삐죽한, 들쭉날쭉한

Ex. snow-capped/jagged peaks

Streak

: If something streaks a surface, it makes long stripes or marks on the surface.

: 기다란 자국을 내다

Ex. Tears streaked her face.

Debris

: pieces from something that has been destroyed or pieces of rubbish or unwanted material that are spread around.

: 잔해, 쓰레기

본문) Smallish bones were scattered among the debris.

Coil

: to wind into a series of circles

: 고리

Ex. a snake's coils

Tether

: to tie an animal to a post so that it cannot move very far

: 밧줄로 잡아 매다, 매어 두다

Ex. The horse had broken loose from its tether.

Mottled

: marked with shapes of different colours without a regular pattern

: 얼룩덜룩한

Ex. The book got wet and is mottled with stains.

Quiver

: If something quivers, it shakes with very small movements.

: (가볍게) 떨다, 떨리다

Ex. Her lip quivered and then she started to cry.

Whisker

: The whiskers of an animal such as a cat or a mouse are the long stiff hairs that grow near its mouth.

: (고양이·쥐 등의) 수염

Leer

: to look or smile at sb in an unpleasant way that shows an evil or sexual interest in them

: 음흉하게 보다[웃다]

Ex. He looked at her with an evil leer.

Wriggle

: to twist and turn your body or part of it with quick short movements

Slash

: to make a long cut with a sharp object, especially in a violent way

: 깊이 베다, 긁다

Ex. She tried to kill herself by slashing her wrists.

Gander

: a male goose.

: 수거위

Taper

: to become gradually narrower

: 끝이 점점 가늘어지다

Ex. The tail tapered to a rounded tip.

Scorch

: to burn and slightly damage a surface by making it too hot

: 태우다, 그슬리다

Ex. Don't stand so near the fire—your coat is scorching!

Scuttle

: to run with quick short steps

: 종종걸음을 치다

Ex. He held his breath as a rat scuttled past.

Scurry

: to run with quick short steps

: 종종걸음을 치다

Ex. She said goodbye and scurried back to work.

Drool

: to let saliva (= liquid) come out of your mouth

: 군침을 흘리다, 침이 나오다

Ex. The dog was drooling at the mouth.

Topple

: to become unsteady and fall down

: 넘어뜨리다

Ex. He brushed past, toppling her from her stool.

Parry

: to defend yourself against sb who is attacking you by pushing their arm, weapon, etc. to one side

: 쳐내다, 막다

Ex. The shot was parried by the goalie.

Lunge

: to make a sudden powerful forward movement, especially in order to attack sb or take hold of sth

: 찌르다, 돌진하다

본문) She parried it and then lunged, stabbing the goblin with her blade.

Stab

: to push a sharp, pointed object, especially a knife, into sb, killing or injuring them

: 찌르다

Ex. She stabbed him in the arm with a screwdriver.

Trance

: a state in which sb seems to be asleep but is aware of what is said to them, for example if they are hypnotized

: (최면 상태와 같은) 가수(假睡) 상태

본문) A screech above them broke her trance.

Swoop

: of a bird or plane to fly quickly and suddenly downwards, especially in order to attack sb/sth

: 위에서 덮치다

Ex. The aircraft swooped down over the buildings.

Corrode

: to destroy sth slowly, especially by chemical action

: 부식시키다, 썩먹다

Ex. Acid corrodes metal.

corrugated

: shaped into a series of regular folds that look like waves

reflex

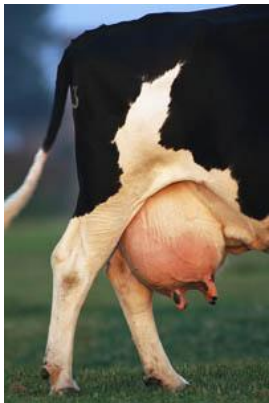
: An automatic response to a simple stimulus which does not require mental processing
: 반사행동
Ex. That was a pure **reflex** action, not anything I needed to think about.

groom

: To attend to one's appearance and clothing
: (머리카락·수염·의복 등을) 다듬다
Ex. I usually groom myself in front of the mirror.

udder

: Part of domestic milk-giving animal that expresses milk, especially cow
: (소·양·염소 등의) 젖통
본문) Her **udder** was covered in what appeared to be writhing black snakes jostling for a position at her reddened teats.



shed

: To cast off, to let fall, be divested of
: (가죽·껍질·뿔 등을) 벗다

Ex. Trees **shed** their leaves in fall.

slick

: Slippery due to a covering of liquid
: 미끄러미끄러한

Ex. This rain is making the roads **slick**.

spurt

: To gush or issue suddenly
: 분출하다

Ex. Blood **spurred** from the wound.

throb

: To pound or beat rapidly or violently
: 맥이 뛰다

Ex. My heart **throbbled** with joy.

hurl

: To throw (something) with force
: 세게 내던지다

Ex. The primitive man **hurled** a spear at a wild animal.

plummet

: To fall quickly
: 떨어지다

Ex. After its ascent, the arrow **plummeted** to earth.

erratically

: unsteadily or randomly
: 불규칙하게

Ex. When I saw the other driver weaving **erratically** across the road, I decided to keep my distance.

rend

: To separate into parts with force or sudden violence
: 찢다, 찢다

Ex. Powder **rends** a rock in blasting.

stucco

: A plaster that is used to coat interior or exterior walls

spiderwick chronicles #5

: 치장 벽토

: The melted rock ejected by a volcano from its crater or fissured sides

Ex. Volcanoes spew **lava**.

tendrils

: A thin, spirally coiling stem that attaches a plant to its support.

: 덩굴손

본문) He could see **tendrils** of smoke.



jut

: To stick out

: 돌출하다

Ex. The balcony **juts** out over the swimming pool.

sawhorse

: A device used to temporarily raise and support pieces of material (for example, timber).

: 톱질 모탕

본문) The **sawhorse** may be designed to fold for storage.



rivulet

: A small brook or stream

: 개울, 작은 물줄기

Ex. A **rivulet** of tears ran down his face.



waver

: To flicker, glimmer, quiver, as a weak light

: 깜빡이며 너울거리다

본문) There, in the wavering light, Jared could see sprites trapped in honey.

sodden

: soaked or drenched with liquid

: 흠뻑 젖은

본문) The sprites squealed as he set each one down on the table in a sticky, sodden heap.

queasy

spiderwick chronicles #5

behoove

: To be necessary

: 마땅하다

Ex. It **behooves** us to raise our hands before we ask a question.

translucent

: allowing light to pass through but scattering it as it does

: 반투명의

본문) Giant cathedral windows, filled with **translucent** mosaics made of glass shards, covered the other wall.

shard

: A piece of broken glass or pottery

: 파편

Ex. Do not drink the drink if the bottle chips and a **shard** of glass falls in to it

: to put into disorder; make messy; rumple

Ex. Their father's black hair looked slightly mussed ,

Furrowed



: to make wrinkles in (the face)

: 주름을 만들다- 찡그리다

: violent or tumultuous motion

: 동기

Ex. There was some commotion outside

Fumbled



: to feel or grope about clumsily

: 손으로 더듬다

Ex. Mallory fumbled with the pulley and managed to lower her dad's hands

Idiotic



: senselessly foolish or stupid

: 어리석은

Ex. And he's got a really idiotic plan to take over the world
