

: to break sth, or to be broken, violently and noisily into many pieces

Ex. Several windows had been smashed.

Hinge

: a piece of metal, plastic, etc. on which a door, lid or gate moves freely as it opens or closes

Ex. The door had been pulled off its hinges.



Dart

: ~ a glance/look (at sb) to look at sb suddenly and quickly

: 시선을 던지다

Ex. He darted an impatient look at Vicky.

Faucet

: a device that controls the flow of water from a pipe

: 수도꼭지, tap

Ex. to turn a faucet on/off

Defrosting

: to become or make sth warmer, especially food, so that it is no longer frozen : 서리를 없애다, 녹이다

Ex. It will take about four hours to defrost.

Plaster

: a substance made of lime, water and sand, that is put on walls and ceilings to give them a smooth hard surface

: 회반죽,가루석고

: to combine or make one thing combine with another : 섞다, 섞이다 Ex. Her tears mingled with the blood on her face. Caning : the act of providing chairs or the like with seats made of woven cane. : 의자 등자리 Rip : to tear sth or to become torn, often suddenly or violently : 찢어지다, 해집어지다 Ex. I ripped my jeans on the fence. Shatter : to suddenly break into small pieces; to make sth suddenly break into small pieces : 산산이 부서지다 Ex. The explosion shattered all the windows in the building. Drift : a large pile of sth, especially snow, made by the wind : 바람에 날려 쌓인 것 Ex. The road was blocked by deep drifts of snow. Brocade

Ex. an old house with crumbling plaster and a leaking roof

: to weave with a raised design or figure

Ex. Women often wore a top layer of the stola, for the rich in brocade.



Footstool

- : a low piece of furniture used for resting your feet on when you are sitting
- : 발 올려놓는 대

Ex. A footstool is a piece of furniture, the purpose of which is to support one's feet.

Scoff

: to talk about sb/sth in a way that makes it clear that you think they are stupid or ridiculous

: 비웃다

Ex. Don't scoff-she's absolutely right.

Squeak

: to speak in a very high voice, especially when you are nervous or excited

: 끽끽거리며 말하다, 앙앙 울다

Ex. Let go of me!' he squeaked nervously.

Ruin

: to damage sth so badly that it loses all its value, pleasure, etc.; to spoil sth : 파괴되다

Ex. The bad weather ruined our trip.

Vigorous

: very active, determined or full of energy

: 힘찬, 정력적인

Ex. This plant is a vigorous grower.

Scrub

: to clean sth by rubbing it hard, perhaps with a brush and usually with soap and water

: 북북 문지르다

Ex. She scrubbed the counters down with bleach.

Squat

: to sit on your heels with your knees bent up close to your body

: 웅크리다, 쪼그리고 앉다

본문) Mallory squatted beside the footstool.

Filthy

: very dirty and unpleasant

- : 불결한, 더러운, 추악한
- Ex. It's filthy in here!

Hireling

: a person who is willing to do anything or work for anyone as long as they are paid

: 부하

본문) master worse than his hirelings.

Dwell

- : to live somewhere
- : 살다, 거주하다
- Ex. For ten years she dwelled among the nomads of North America.

Foul

- : dirty and smelling bad
- : 더러운, 불결한

Ex. a foul-smelling prison

Clatter

- : to move making a loud noise like hard objects knocking together
- : 달가닥거리다

Ex. She heard him clattering around downstairs.

Wreckage

: the parts of a vehicle, building, etc. that remain after it has been badly damaged or destroyed

Feline



: any of various lithe-bodied roundheaded fissiped mammals, many with retractile claws

Ex. The feline world includes lions, tigers, panthers, and house cats.

Writhe

- : to twist, as in pain, struggle, or embarrassment
- : 몸부림치다

Ex. She was **writhing** around on the floor in agony.

Feral

: existing in a wild or untamed state

: 야생의

Ex. Feral cats have adapted well to life in the desert. Lever



Man lifting a stone with a lever

: to move or lift with or as if with a lever

: ~을 (지레로) 움직이다

Ex. They managed to lever the door open.

Holler

- : to yell or shout
- : 외치다

Ex. Holler when you're ready for a drink.

Sprawl

: to sit or lie with the body and limbs spread out awkwardly

: 팔다리를 아무렇게나 벌리고 앉다, 큰 대자로 눕다

Ex. He was **sprawling** in an armchair in front of the TV.

Tug of war



: a contest of strength in which two teams tug on opposite ends of a rope, each trying to pull the other across a dividing line

: 줄다리기

Ex. The two parties were in a bitter tug-of-war.

Pry

: to raise, move, or force open with a lever

:~을 지레로 들어올리다

Ex. He **pried** up a stone with a lever.

Strain

: to pull, draw, or stretch tight

:~을 팽팽하게 하다, 잡아당기다

Ex. She strained against the ropes that held her.

Gutter

: a trough fixed under or along the eaves for draining rainwater from a roof

: 배수로

Ex. He dropped his keys in the gutter.

Haul

: something that is pulled or transported

: 잡은 것, 획득물

Ex. Angling is a great fun when there is a good haul of fish.

Lair

: the den or dwelling of a wild animal

: 은신처

Ex. All the animals are smothered in their lairs.

Dagger



: a shot pointed weapon with sharp edges

: (양날의) 단도

Ex. He thrust a dagger into his enemy's heart

Shard

: a piece of broken pottery, especially one found in an archaeological dig

: 조각, 파편

Ex. There is a **shard** of glass in his finger.

: having such a great effect on you that you feel confused and do not know how to react

Urge

: a strong wish or need

Reckless

: not caring or worrying about the possible bad or dangerous results of your actions

Ex. He was accused of causing death by *reckless driving*.

Mortal

: a human - used especially when comparing humans with gods, spirits etc : 917

Ex. She likes old stories about gods and mortals.

reflex

: An automatic response to a simple stimulus which does not require mental processing

Ex. That was a pure reflex action, not anything I needed to think about.

groom

- : To attend to one's appearance and clothing

Ex. I usually groom myself in front of the mirror.

udder

: Part of domestic milk-giving animal that expresses milk, especially cow

:(소·양·염소 등의) 젖통

shed

: To cast off, to let fall, be divested of : (가죽·껍질·뿔 등을) 벗다

: A plaster that is used to coat interior or exterior walls

Ex. Most of the houses are faced with white **stucco**, but some are faced with brick.

lava

: The melted rock ejected by a volcano from its crater or fissured sides

: 용암

Ex. Volcanoes spew lava.

tendril

- : A thin, spirally coiling stem that attaches a plant to its support.
- : 덩굴손

본문) He could see tendrils of smoke.



jut

- : To stick out
- : 돌출하다

Ex. The balcony juts outs out over the swimming pool.

sawhorse

: A device used to temporarily raise and support pieces of material (for example, timber).

rivulet

: A small brook or stream : 개울, 작은 물줄기 Ex. A **rivulet** of tears ran down his face.



waver

: To flicker, glimmer, quiver, as a weak light

sodden

- : soaked or drenched with liquid
- : 흠뻑 젖은

본문) The sprites squealed as he set each one down on the table in a sticky, sodden heap.

queasy

: causing nausea or uneasiness

: 역겨운

본문) The thought of the tiny drowned faeries made him feel queasy

alarmingly

: In a way the induces fear or concern

: 불안하게 하는

본문) It swung alarmingly.

behoove

: To be necessary

: 마땅하다

Ex. It behooves us to raise our hands before we ask a question.

translucent

: allowing light to pass through but scattering it as it does

: 반투명의

본문) Giant cathedral windows, filled with **translucent** mosaics made of glass shards, covered the other wall.

shard

: A piece of broken glass or pottery

: 파편

Ex. Do not drink the drink if the bottle chips and a shard of glass falls in to it

Hazel



: light golden brown, as the color of a hazelnut.

Shakily



- : tending to shake or tremble.

Ex. "Leave them alone" Jared said shakily

Dine

- : to eat the principal meal of the day; have dinner.

Ex You live in palaces dine on banquets and clothe yourselves in fine silks and velvet like royalty

Feeble



: physically weak, as from age or sickness; frail.

Viper



: a malignant or spiteful person.

boon

- : A timely blessing or benefit
- : 혜택


